Our unique approach relies on a team of volunteers, donors and community partners to deliver compassionate, client-centered programs focused on hunger, mental health and financial assistance.

We have several ways that your youth group can volunteer for us:

Food Drive: Collect nonperishable food items for our food pantry. Here is a list of items we need most: <https://bit.ly/IFSSfooddrive> or do a themed drive like “peanut butter & jelly” or kids’ snack items.

Diaper Drive: Collect packages of diapers and unscented wipes for the children of our food pantry clients. We are especially in need of larger sizes (Size 4, 5 or 6): <https://interfaithsocialservices.org/diapers/>

Personal Care Kits: Our clients are also in need of personal care products. Organize a “personal care product drive” and collect enough soap, shampoo, toilet paper, deodorant, etc. for each kit (full-size items). Here is a list of items we need most: <http://bit.ly/ISShygiene>

Seasonal Drives: Help us spread joy to our youngest clients by collecting items for one of our seasonal drives. Contact our Assistant Food Pantry Manager Leslie Wittmann at leslie@interfaithsocialservices.org for a list of specific items for each drive.

- Bunny Baskets (Spring) – Collect supplies (plastic eggs, candy, small toys) for our annual basket assembly.
- Backpacks (Summer) – Collect backpacks and school supplies.
- Halloween costumes (September) – Collect new Halloween costumes and accessories.
- Holiday gifts (November) – Run a toy drive or “adopt” children for the holidays.
